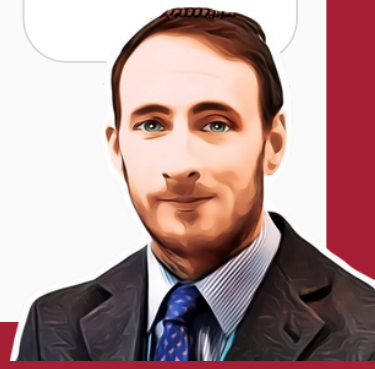

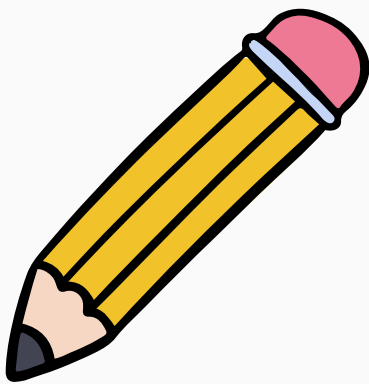

We have had a lot of complaints from our neighbours about parents parking over their driveways, at drop off and pick up times.

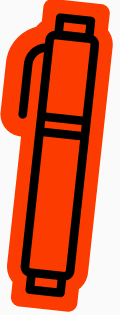
We understand they are busy times of day however we still need to be respectful of local residents.

And when he was gone forth into the way, a certain man running up and kneeling before him, asked him, Good Master, what shall I do that I may receive life everlasting? 1And Jesus said to him, Why callest thou me good?
