How should we behave and why?

We want pupils to behave safely, respectfully and responsibly. This means we are behaving in a way that allows all children to learn without distraction. We should respect all adults in school because they always try their best to look after us, and to help us learn. We should respect one another because we want to be happy at school, and ensure everyone else is happy. We should respect our school because we are proud to come to St George's and want it to look great. We should always try to make the right choice and do our best learning all the time. We should always listen to instructions that help guide us to right choices when we make mistakes with our choices.
